David Della Porta:

- ❖ 3 plus years ago presented mixed use for 355 W. Lancaster Ave- 3-4 stories
- ❖ Currently has two plans- either a gas station/Super Wawa type of store **OR** an apartment building 3 stories plus one as would have 20 units of affordable housing. First floor would have shops. The latter would require a change in the zoning map- this would require Commissioners advertise and then vote.
- ❖ Jesse Lytle from Haverford College said the college's main interests are -walkability, retail, traffic and safety, and appreciates green space
- ❖ Hala asked Civic to vote on preference of Super Wawa v. Apartment building- Most Board members preferred the apartment building with one Board member abstaining from both options.

- ❖ LM offering small business forgivable loan (virus related) and housing assistance
